

Georges River Regional Council Annual Report for 2009

(A report from the Georges River Regional Council.)

Introduction

1. The Regional Council met six times during 2009. The Rt Rev Peter Tasker's last meeting was in June 2009. The Council recorded a motion of thanks to God and appreciation to Peter & Joan for the ministry they had exercised in the Region from 2002.

2. The Council meets at church halls in the Region, and we receive first hand reports from the Rector of the Parish about the ministry of the local church. All of the parishes in the Georges River Region have been actively involved in Connect09. In 2009 new congregations were commenced in Marrickville and Fairfield. Mr Ross Ciano began a new congregation in a shop on Marrickville Road and this has now become a regular meeting place for a group of at least 20 adults each Sunday. The Rev Cam Phong's ministry at Fairfield was directed to 2nd generation Vietnamese young people in the Fairfield area. From a small beginning, it now has a regular congregation of about 30 adults.

Unfortunately because of the Global Financial crisis, the Regional Council was not able to continue the employment of the Rev Abdallah Bahri – serving people from a Muslim background, and Mr Phin Tang, the Refugee Coordinator. Mr Tang's ministry was partly funded by the Archbishop's Community Project and the Regional Council. They were retrenched in 2010.

4. We are thankful to God for these two important ministries and for the work that these men did over the past years.

Regional Council

5. The Georges River Regional Council was constituted under the Region's Ordinance 1995 and its functions, powers and duties are as established by Clause 6 of that ordinance. The Region covers the Areas Deaneries of Canterbury, St George, Bankstown, Salt Pan Creek and Liverpool in this Diocese.

Ministry Activities/Strategies

8. In 2009 the Council received a Synod grant of \$566,000 for ministry purposes. The Council has been giving special attention to

the Canterbury/Bankstown area deaneries as there has been significant social change over the past decades.

9. The Council has also employed a clergy person to promote Cross-Cultural work among women in these deaneries. The purpose of this ministry is to develop friendships with Muslim women so that Anglican people have a better understanding of cultural differences. Through Ordinance Income, the Region has been able to continue to employ people so we can face the challenges of connecting with the many different cultures in the Region.
