10. Amendment of the Archbishop of Sydney Appointment Ordinance 1982

- 10.1 The Standing Committee has recently passed 2 ordinances to amend the Archbishop of Sydney Appointment Ordinance 1982 (the "Principal Ordinance"). Both of those ordinances has received assent.
- 10.2 The Archbishop of Sydney Appointment Ordinance 1982 Amendment Ordinance 2001 made 2 amendments of substance to the Principal Ordinance -
- (a) it amended clause 36 to remove inconsistencies between that clause and the requirements of the Provincial Ordinance for the Confirmation of Bishops Elections (NSW) 1965, and
- (b) it amended clause 37 to remove inconsistencies between that clause and section 8 of the 1961 Constitution.
- 10.3 Clauses 36 and 37 of the Principal Ordinance become relevant only if the person elected to be the Archbishop is not a bishop at the time of his election and the election is not confirmed under the Provincial Ordinance referred to in 10.2(a) above.
- 10.4 The Archbishop of Sydney Appointment Ordinance 1982 Further Amendment Ordinance 2001 made 2 amendments of substance to clause 9(1) of the Principal Ordinance -
- (a) the clause has been amended to make it clear that a determination to be made under that clause by the nominators of a candidate is to be made by a majority decision if the nominators are not otherwise unanimous, and
- (b) the nominators are no longer required to determine between themselves who will otherwise speak in favour of a nomination at each stage.
- 10.5 The amendment referred to in 10.4(b) is intended to make it clear that any member of the Synod (whether a nominator or not) may speak in favour of a nominee at each stage, subject to receiving the call of the President and debate continuing. Similar rights for a member to speak against a nomination are found in clauses 15, 16 and 25 of the Principal Ordinance.
- 10.6 A copy of the Principal Ordinance, consolidated to include all amendments including those made by the abovementioned amending ordinance, is enclosed with this circular.

11. More on Terms and Conditions of Appointment

In item 5.2 of the Circular of 28 March 2001, members were advised that the Standing Committee had appointed a committee to review the level of stipend as to its appropriateness for the tasks and duties of the Archbishop. The committee has reported, and the Standing Committee has accepted the recommendation that the Archbishop's stipend be maintained at the level of 200% of the minimum stipend for a minister.

- 12.4 Please wear your name tag as it is our major means of ensuring that Synod members only are admitted to the Theatre after the Presidential address on 4 June.
- 12.5 If you lose your name tag or forget to bring it, see the Deputy Registrar, Mrs Catherine Rich, at the Theatre for a temporary replacement.
- 12.6 There is a public gallery only for the opening sitting of the Synod.

Returning Officers/Voting

- 12.7 Ken Bowden and Andrew Sillar are in charge of vote counting.
- 12.8 The voting procedures for the various stages are printed on the business paper. Please also revisit items 3.1 to 3.38 inclusive of the circular of 28 March.

New Lay Representatives

- 12.9 If you have been elected to fill a casual vacancy, before taking part in the Synod you must make a declaration that you are a communicant member of the Anglican Church of Australia and that you are not a member of any other church.
- 12.10 You can make this declaration at the 2nd floor reception desk in St Andrew's House during office hours before the session or at the Secretaries' table in the Theatre during the Synod session. Please show your certificate of election when you make the declaration.

13. Arrangements for the Body and Soul

Car Parking
